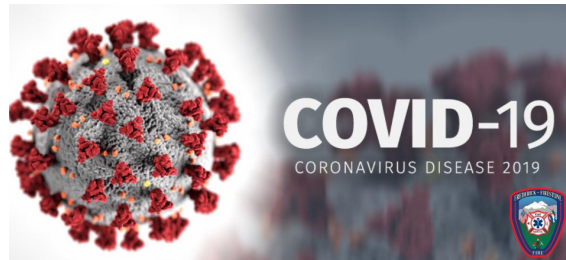
## Open Burn Permits Denied, Canceled

The Weld County Department of Health has announced it is denying new, and cancelling all open burn permits immediately due to continuing concerns with the COVID-19 pandemic and its associated threat to people with heart and/or lung disease. The decision was made following the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's message which highly discourages open burning at this time. ## COVID-19 Update: What You Can Do

While things are changing daily when it comes to COVID-19, everyone can take steps to limit their exposure. We recommend the following:



- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 or more seconds. Washing your hands should be done after using the restroom, before eating, before and after prepping food, after wiping your nose, coughing or sneezing. Wash your hands often.
- Stay home when you are sick. Even if you feel a little off and not well, better safe than sorry.
- Avoid close contact with anyone who is or may be sick.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with a minimum of 60% alcohol.

- Utilize disinfectant sprays in your home, business or vehicle.
- Avoid touching your face, especially your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Practice social distancing and always allow at least 6 feet of distance between yourself and others.
- Avoid large groups and limit groups to no more than 10 people.
